

## Keep Safe Scotland – Phone App



**KEEP SAFE** aims to help disabled people feel safe in their community.



**KEEP SAFE** works with local shops and public buildings to create safe places for people to go if they need help.



The shops and other buildings will put a **KEEP SAFE** sticker in their window where it can easily be seen.



You can have a **KEEP SAFE card**, which holds important information about you and the contact details of who can help you.



If you need help, you can go into a shop or building where you see the **KEEP SAFE** logo. Staff will help you.



They can help to contact the person you want to come and support you.

They can give you directions to where you want to go.



They can phone the police for you if you need them to.



You can find all the **KEEP SAFE** places on the '**Keep Safe Scotland**' phone app.



You can get this from the Apple store or from Google Play.



The Phone App has 4 choices which can give you more information.



Keep Safe helps you to find all **KEEP SAFE** places in Scotland.



You can plan your route.

Or find your nearest **KEEP SAFE** place.

Or search for Keep Safe places.



The Police Scotland section helps you to make reports of hate crime.



You can report online (non emergency).

Or you can call 101 (non emergency).

Or you can call 999 (emergency).



Community Information helps you find out what is happening in other areas of Scotland.
